


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Bullying Awareness & Prevention

Ontario has designated the week beginning on the third Sunday of November as Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week to help promote safe schools and a positive learning environment. At St. Jerome, we invited "Brave Education" to conduct virtual workshops with our Grade 1-8 students. Both inperson and remote students participated with their classes. FDK classes received a class copy of the book, "How Brave Found His Roar," and students in grades 1-3/4 received their own copy to take home. Grade 4-8 students took part in an interactive workshop discussing anti-bullying awareness and prevention strategies. We hope that this program helped to provide students with the necessary tools as to be aware and deal with conflict in proactive ways.

Inclement Weather Procedures








When buses are cancelled due to inclement weather, parents are encouraged to listen for reports on the radio and television stations. Parents will receive an email through School Messenger by 7 am. Notifications will be posted on the Board website, all school websites and the Board's Twitter account (@YCDSB) and School Twitter (@StJeromeCES)

With the winter season upon us, this is a reminder to parents and guardians that students are to dress appropriately for outdoor play. Remember to have them wear a warm coat, hat, mittens and proper footwear. Many of our students are often getting their pants and socks wet during recesses and need an extra change of clothing. Please ensure that your child has an extra pair of pants and socks at school in case of a wet or muddy emergency. Please review with your child the importance of keeping snow and ice on the ground so that everyone has fun in the snow. In agreement with the CSC, students will go outside for recess unless it is -20 degrees Celsius or at principal discretion.

NEW this season are our REVISED INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES. This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the YCDSB Inclement Weather Procedure must change based on direction from York Region Public Health. **If buses and other forms of school transportation are cancelled due to inclement weather, all schools will be closed to students. DO NOT bring your child to school. All students are to remain at home and access remote learning for the day.** Teachers will provide live remote learning for all students through their virtual classrooms.

Hybrid Learning

Since October 14th, we have adopted an entirely new and never tried before teaching/learning model. In every effort to provide support and be proactive, it is essential for parents to be familiar with remote learning, especially if your child is a face-to-face learner. Please practice having your child log on and navigate google classroom so in case there is ever a need to switch modalities your child will be ready. Please be mindful of the hybrid learning environment, attendance protocols, privacy and code of conduct. This information has been sent to parents via email through our YCDSB Communications Department. It is important to review this so we could establish and maintain a positive learning experience for all.


Safe Arrival Reminder
